Strumming Patterns

The strumming patterns that you can use with the intermediate chords are the same as the strumming patterns that you can use with the beginner chords. However, you may want to experiment with different strumming patterns to find ones that sound good with the songs that you are playing.

Once you have mastered the intermediate chords, you can start learning some advanced chords. These chords are more challenging to learn, but they will give you the ability to play more complex songs.

- C6 Major 6th
- Am6 Minor 6th
- Fmaj6 Major 6th
- Gmaj6 Major 6th
- Dm6 Minor 6th



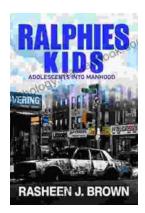
