- 1. Draw a horizontal line on your paper or poster board. This line will represent the timeline.
- 2. Mark the beginning and end of the timeline with the dates of the earliest and latest events on your list.
- 3. Divide the timeline into equal intervals. The intervals can be years, decades, or centuries, depending on the length of the timeline.
- 4. Place the events on the timeline in chronological order. You can use markers or crayons to color-code the events, or you can write a brief description of each event next to the date.
- 5. Add a title to your timeline and any other information that you think is relevant.

Using Timelines

Timelines can be used for a variety of purposes. They can be used to:


- Track the history of a person, a place, or an event.

- Have your kids create a timeline of their own. Give your kids some paper and markers, and ask them to create a timeline of their own life or a historical event that they are interested in.



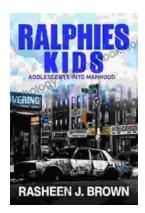
