- 3. Next, make the "Love You" lettering. To do this, thread your needle with white yarn and make a knot at the end. Insert the needle into the plastic canvas one row below the heart and one column to the left of the center. Make a half stitch, and then insert the needle back into the plastic canvas one row up and one column to the right. Repeat this process to create a row of half stitches. Continue making rows of half stitches until you have completed the "Love You" lettering. Secure the yarn by weaving it through the back of the last few stitches.
- 4. Now, make the border. To do this, thread your needle with pink yarn and make a knot at the end. Insert the needle into the plastic canvas one row outside the "Love You" lettering and one column to the left of the center. Make a half stitch, and then insert the needle back into the plastic canvas one row up and one column to the right. Repeat this process to create a row of half stitches. Continue making rows of half stitches until you have completed the border. Secure the yarn by weaving it through the back of the last few stitches.
- 5. Finally, make the trim. To do this, thread your needle with black yarn and make a knot at the end. Insert the needle into the plastic canvas one row outside the border and one column to the left of the center. Make a half stitch, and then insert the needle back into the plastic canvas one row up and one column to the right. Repeat this process to create a row of half stitches. Continue making rows of half stitches until

you have completed the trim. Secure the yarn by weaving it through the back of the last few stitches.

#### **Tips**

- To make the napkin holder more durable, you can laminate it with clear contact paper.
- You can also add a ribbon or bow to the napkin holder for decoration.
- This napkin holder is also a great way to use up leftover yarn.




