
Marius' Mules: Vi Caesar Vow



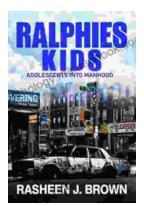
